Diploma(s) and Transcripts	 A four-year bachelor's degree with eight semesters of graded transcripts is required for the Master's program. Applicants with three-year degrees, for example, from some universities of India, must either have a four-year Indian bachelor's degree or completed an Indian master's degree, if the bachelor's degree is of less than four years' duration. Applicants who will have completed their bachelor's degree by Spring 2020, but have not received their official diploma, may, in lieu of the diploma: a) attach an official letter from the Ministry of Higher Education, certifying their graduation as well as their final transcript evidencing attainment of a bachelor's degree or b) if graduating in Spring 2020, a copy of their current transcript For those applicants <u>invited for an interview</u>, officially attested documents are required: students who graduated in Fall 2019 or earlier must have all diplomas and transcripts attested by the Afghan Ministry of Higher Education and Ministry of Foreign Affair by the interview date; students graduating in Spring 2020 will require a letter from the university's registrar affirming that they are on track to graduate by May 2020 – officially attested transcripts will be required before a final offer is extended. Foreign degree holders must present and provide a second original copy of their diploma and transcript at the time of the interview.
